History and Overview

In September 2010, Good Shepherd Ministries surveyed 669 people using its services. 9.7% of those surveyed identified themselves as Veterans.

This number was higher than anyone expected, given that Veterans make up only 4% of the adult male population in Canada, and less than 1% of the adult female population.* The survey inspired Good Shepherd Ministries, Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) and the Royal Canadian Legion to form a partnership to help homeless Veterans in Toronto.

As a result of that partnership, two VAC case managers worked out of Good Shepherd Centre until 2018. The Royal Canadian Legion contributed and continues to contribute financial assistance to newly housed Veterans.

In 2016, Good Shepherd added a Veterans Transition Worker to provide intensive case management to Veterans with more complex needs.

In 2019, Good Shepherd established a Veterans Housing Navigation team by adding peer support to its case management services.

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Providing Veterans with a Wide Range of Services

The Veterans Housing Navigation team provides case management and one-onone support in the community for Veterans whose service has been verified.

Case Management

The Veterans Housing Navigation team provides comprehensive and, when needed, intensive case management for up to 30 Veterans over the course of a year. This case management includes assistance with finding housing and help with connecting clients to local supports within their community.

Drug & Alcohol Recovery Enrichment (DARE)

Veterans are given priority access to 5 DARE beds. The DARE Program at Good Shepherd Centre is an abstinence -based residential program for homeless men with addictions who need a supportive safe place to live until they begin treatment and/or find housing. DARE clients receive pre and post treatment services in addition to shelter, meals, clothing, and more.

Living Better

The Veterans Housing Navigation Team facilitates a group that addresses the unique needs of Veterans. The group is a safe place where Veterans can freely discuss and share their concerns. Some topics covered in past groups: communication, anger management, self care, stress management, tenants rights, addictions and mental health. The group will also provide practical skill development, e.g. food preparation.

Who Can Use These Services?


You may be eligible to use these services if you are:
